Minutes of 46th Annual Meeting Southern Poultry Science Society January 28, 2025

- I. With ~100 members present, President Roshan Adhikari called the meeting to order. A quorum was declared. Greg Engelke was appointed Parliamentarian. Tellers were. The minutes from the previous meeting on January 30, 2024, were presented via QR Code and posted on the SPSS website. No corrections were offered and the minutes were accepted as posted.
- II. Executive Secretary, Mary Beck, presented the financial report for the 2023-2024 fiscal year (Attachment 1).

The 2022-2023 Financial Report was reviewed. The beginning balance in all three accounts on 10/1/2023 was \$120,601.33 and the ending balance on 9/30/2024 was \$138,694.51 for a net gain of \$18,093.10. Sponsor income for the 2025 meeting was \$28,000; Morgan Stanley income was \$13,587.54; with miscellaneous interest and reimbursements of \$535, for a total of \$42,127.31. Expenditures were as follows: Student Awards, \$9,000; Judges/Moderators Gift Cards, \$4,250.; PSA Sponsorship, \$2,500; Administrative Costs, \$2,309.77 and ES Travel, \$3,972.36; for a total of \$24,934.13.

There were no questions and the finance report was accepted as presented.

III. Bob Buresh, Chair of the Audit Committee, presented the report of the Audit Committee. (Attachment 2). The committee commended the Executive Secretary for excellent records and efforts to secure sponsorship support.

There were no questions and the report was accepted as presented.

IV. President Adhikari presented the proposed constitutional amendments, the majority of which are housekeeping changes to better reflect current practices, including addition of Jon Cole with PSA to the Wells Fargo bank accounts as back-up administrator to the Executive Secretary and streamlining of officer duties. The substantive amendment is the creation of an Associate Executive Secretary position to report to the Executive Secretary, to assist with responsibilities associated with organizing and running the International Poultry Scientific Forum, and also to be added to the Wells Fargo Accounts as back-up administrator to the Executive Secretary.

There was a motion to accept the constitution and bylaws as presented to the membership on December 19, 2024; the motion was seconded; the vote to approve was unanimous.

V. President Adhikari presented the Resolutions Report (Attachment 3); the report is entered into the minutes and only the resolutions of remembrance were read at the meeting, with a moment of silence following.

There were no questions and the report was accepted as presented.

VI. The Program Report was presented by 2nd VP Jarred Oxford (Appendix 4). There were 410 (+40) abstracts for a record high (224 orals (+14) and 195 (+26) posters) and () attendees. Undergraduates presenting: 20 (+6) (9 orals, 11 posters) and Graduate Students 152 (+24) (95 Orals, 57 posters).

There were no questions and the report was accepted as presented.

VII. First Vice President Dianna Bourassa expressed appreciation to the judges and presented the student awards. Each graduate student received a certificate and check for \$500; the top two grad student winners received an SPSS travel award for \$500. Each undergraduate participant received a certificate; the top u.g. oral and poster presenters each received the Don R. Sloan award and \$250. Each session chair and judge received a \$50 gift certificate.
